Children must have a qualifying medical condition (e.g., cerebral palsy, diabetes, hearing loss, epilepsy, etc)</p>	<p>Sliding fee</p>	<p>Case management and care coordination for families of children with very complex medical needs. The children must meet eligibility requirements based on their diagnosis. Cystic fibrosis and bleeding disorders are lifetime coverage. Services for children with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders are not covered.
